Pupils are required to use accurate grammar, spelling and punctuation.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Tips throughout help pupils to work on their accuracy.</li> <li>Phonics video and worksheet in the front-of-class teaching resources help pupils to use correct pronunciation and to spell correctly throughout the course.</li> <li>Worksheets in front-of-class teaching resources support grammar and vocabulary acquisition.</li> <li>Interactive activities in the online homework and practice, support learning grammar and vocabulary (including correct spelling and transcription skills).</li> </ul>	<p>e.g. Studio 1 Pupil Book p. 29 (tip on accents) p. 17 (exercise checking accuracy of partner's work) p. 63 (exercise checking accuracy of own work)</p> <p>Studio 1 front-of-class teaching resources p. 8 Speaking skills video, Worksheet 1.1</p>
Pupils are required to 'transcribe words and short sentences that they hear with increasing accuracy'.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Phonics approach at beginning – words and gestures used to introduce key sounds and help pupils to learn sound &gt; spelling links.</li> <li>Opportunities to practise transcription throughout.</li> <li>Online homework, practice and support vocabulary activities give transcription practice.</li> </ul>	<p>Studio 1 front-of-class teaching resources p. 8 Speaking skills video, Worksheet 1.1</p> <p>The audio recordings in Studio provide a wealth of material that could be used for transcription.</p> <p>e.g. from Studio 1: TG p. 17 / CD1 track 2 (likes and dislikes), TG p. 21 / CD1 track 5 (survival kit), TG p. 24 / CD1 track 6 (personality).</p> <p>Alternatively, teachers could read aloud short extracts from the reading texts in the Pupil Book for pupils to transcribe. e.g. from Studio 1: p. 11, ex. 6; p. 29, ex. 5; p. 74, ex. 1</p> <p>Studio 3 front-of-class teaching resources Listening Skills Worksheets (Rouge) 1.1, (Vert) 1.2</p>

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<p>Pupils are required to develop confidence in speaking, including dealing with the unexpected.</p> <p><b>Build skills for new GCSE</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Speaking tasks on all core teaching spreads allow pupils to practice speaking in all topics covered.</li> <li>Emphasis on pronunciation aids confident speaking.</li> <li>Regular focus on questions helps pupils to be confident in conversation.</li> <li><i>En plus</i> speaking skills spreads focus on helping pupils to speak spontaneously or at greater length.</li> <li>Pupil Book 3 has three dedicated speaking skills spreads designed to further enhance pupils' skills and encourage more extended speaking, as a forerunner to GCSE.</li> <li>Studio Toolkit introduces and provides resources for using Classroom Talk approach to spontaneous speaking.</li> </ul>	<p>See all core teaching spreads, Pupil Books e.g. Studio 1 pp. 50–51, exs. 2, 4 and 6.</p> <p>Studio 1 phonics worksheet (1.1) + pronunciation tips throughout</p> <p>e.g. Studio 1: pp. 8–9 (exs. 3 &amp; 5, tip next to ex. 3), p. 14 (ex. 2), p. 28 (grammar box)</p> <p>e.g. Studio 1: pp. 20–21.</p> <p>Studio 3 Rouge and Vert pp. 22–23, pp. 68–69, pp. 112–113.</p> <p>Studio KS3 French Toolkit Videos showing examples of classroom talk and spontaneous speech in action.</p>
