

Act 2 scenes 3 and 4

Character: Friar Lawrence

This is the first time we have met the Friar, who will come to play an important part in the lives of Romeo and Juliet. He was Romeo's confessor, the priest to whom he confessed his sins and from whom he received forgiveness. It is obvious that he knows Romeo very well. Act 2 scene 3 gives us a good picture of the Friar and of his relationship with Romeo.

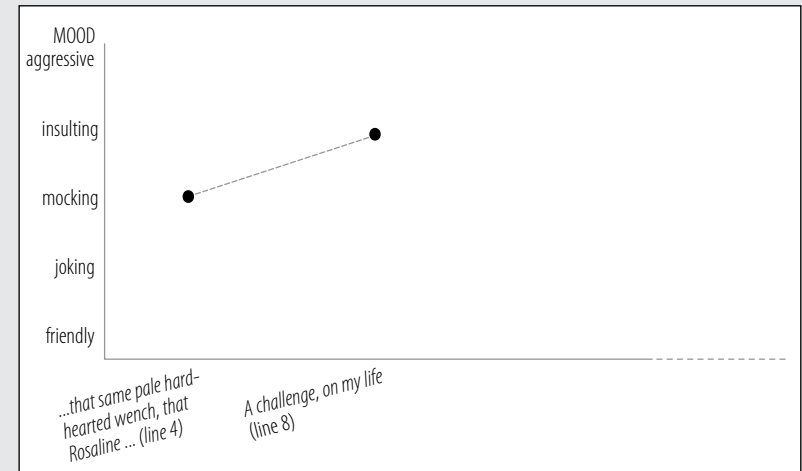
- 2 For each of the words you have chosen, find some **evidence** to support your choice. Copy the table below and use it to record your ideas.
