Decodable books for learning to read

Key messages from the **Reading Framework**

Pupils should be reading 'books that are consistent with their developing phonic knowledge and that do not require them to use other strategies to work out words'.

Since pupils build up their GPC knowledge cumulatively, teachers can be sure that pupils should be able to decode every word in each 'decodable' book they read from that programme, provided they are read in the prescribed order.

Schools should help parents to understand that books sent home for their children to read should match the GPCs they can already decode.

How we can help



- Matched to the progression of the Bug Club Phonics programme, these decodable reading books are for practice and application of focus GPCs (Grapheme Phoneme Correspondence) from Phase 1 to Phase 5 and tricky words.
- Books are aligned to children's developing phonic knowledge.



- Reception and Year 1 books matched to the Bug Club Phonics progression, and aligned to children's developing phonic knowledge.
- These fully decodable books can be used to consolidate and secure GPCs, build fluency and begin to focus on comprehension.

Books for pupils to read independently (post-decodable)

Key messages from the **Reading Framework**

After reading the last decodable books, it is vital that pupils read widely and frequently to increase their confidence and fluency.

The extent of vocabulary and length of a book a child can read largely depends on their familiarity with it and motivation to read it.

Selecting books that the teacher has read aloud and that the class has enjoyed together motivates pupils to read books that include new vocabulary and language structures that they might not otherwise have read for themselves, as well as challenging ideas.

Encouraging children to choose a wide range of books to read for themselves motivates and nurtures engagement.

How we can help



 A range of carefully levelled reading books to build children's confidence, fluency and enable them to gain reading miles through books matched to their current reading ability.



- Use Reading Corner to encourage reading for pleasure, where children choose books according to their interests.
- Reading Corner includes a wide range of 'free choice' books including stories by diverse authors and illustrators, and the eBook versions include 'Read to Me' audio at KS1 to enable children to enjoy books that are beyond their own level of reading.



- For Reception and KS1.
- Read these engaging storybooks books aloud to your class to encourage excitement around reading for pleasure and to systematically teach cross curricular vocabulary.
- Pupils can browse the eBook with audio or watch the video presentation to revisit books that are beyond their own level of reading.

Children should have ample opportunity to listen to teachers read aloud a wide range of books.

How we can help



- For Reception and Key Stage 1.
- These books are the ideal read-aloud for teachers.
- Encourage excitement around reading for pleasure and use these engaging fiction and non-fiction books to systematically teach cross-curricular vocabulary.



- A wide range of books for KS1 and KS2.
- These books are ideal for independent reading or for sharing as a class, as a read-aloud.
- Includes a variety of genres, covering a diverse range of topics so all children can find something they love.

Provide books that give the most pleasure, as a hook to wanting to read and put in the reading miles.

- Lime Plus and KS2 Red Plus books provide extended reading for children who are ready for it.

How we can help

Engage children with great books and stories, written by a broad range of authors, ideas and language.

Identify a core set of literature for each year group that can either be read aloud in story times or read by pupils. Including highquality contemporary and classic texts: fiction, non-fiction, poetry and prose. Teachers should also

new books.

'Hi-lo' books

Key messages from the **Reading Framework**

Ensure engagement with books that provide high interest content at an easy reading level.

Motivate struggling readers by providing books on topics that are engaging and are also targeted toward their independent reading level to build reading fluency, vocabulary, background knowledge, and interest in reading.

How we can help



- High-interest/low-reading-level books that take KS2 children from a reading age of 5 up to 9.5.
- Hundreds of fiction and non-fiction texts and eBooks with a variety of engaging topics, from animals to space travel, to hook even the most reluctant readers.



- Rapid Phonics provides a range of decodable hi-lo fiction and non-fiction books matched to the Rapid Phonics intervention progression.
- Allows older children who have not yet mastered phonics to experience success by reading ageappropriate books.



Books should be organised carefully – matched to the appropriate level and grouped by themes

Key messages from the **Reading Framework**

Organise books by age, type, interest and subject.

Book lists should be refreshed regularly as new books are published and new teachers arrive to avoid being set in stone.
