Key messages from the **Reading Framework**

- Struggling readers need urgent support – teachers should be able to identify them and provide the extra support needed to get them reading confidently.
- There should be a strong focus on getting pupils to discuss opinions and ideas. To avoid more confident students dominating conversations, paired talk as part of a whole class discussion is an effective way to ensure everyone gets a chance to contribute.
- Reading across the curriculum supports the development of subject knowledge and vocabulary – texts selected should be accessible, ageappropriate and interesting to encourage learning through reading.
