

• Cats are mammals, which means that females produce milk to feed their young.



Cat habitats

There are 37 species of wild cats in the world. They live in many habitats from snow-capped mountains to deserts, and grasslands to tropical rainforests. Most of the seven biggest cats are found in places with wet and dry seasons where the weather is warm all year round.


Tiger tales

Tigers are the largest and most powerful of all the big cats. A tiger is ten times stronger than a person. All five types of tiger are covered in striking stripes. Each animal's markings are **unique**, just like human fingerprints.




The biggest of them all


Amur tigers are the largest of all tigers. They live in the freezing forests of Russia, China and North Korea. A thick, furry coat protects them from the cold.



Only Bengal tigers give birth to white cubs, and these are very rare. Few white tigers exist in the wild.
