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The suffix -ly

You can add the suffix -ly to some adjectives to turn them into adverbs.

complete (adjective) + ly = complete (adverb)

sad + ly = sadly

quick + ly = quickly

kind + ly = kindly

If the adjective ends in *l*, the adverb will have double *l*.

real + ly = really

final + ly = finally

cool + ly = coolly

You can even add the suffix -ly to words that already end with a suffix.

hopeless + ly = hopeless ly

swimming + ly = swimming ly
