# The /ee/ sound spelt *ei* and *ie*


The /ee/ sound can be spelt in many ways, including ei and ie.

Think of the saying *i before e, except after c*.

If the /ee/ sound comes immediately after *c*, use *ei*, as in *deceive*, *conceive* and *ceiling*.

If it doesn't, use *ie*, as in *believe* and *achieve*.

There are some exceptions to this rule, like *protein*, *caffeine* and *seize*, which have to be learnt.
