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# Using a or an

# Rule

These words are called articles:

a an

A noun phrase is a group of words containing a noun. All the words in the phrase give more information about the noun. Noun phrases often begin with an article.

I saw **a cat** today. I saw **a black cat** today.

• When the article comes before a word that begins with a consonant sound, use a.

a horse a ginger cat a small fish a badly-behaved dog

• When the article comes before a word that begins with a vowel sound, use *an*.

an enormous cat an interesting fish an angry dog

 Be careful. Some words start with a consonant but begin with a vowel sound.

an hour an honest person

Some words start with a vowel but begin with a consonant sound.

a unicycle a unicorn



article: words like a, an and the

**noun:** a word used to name a place, a person, a thing or an idea,

for example: leg, Scotland, woman, sadness

**noun phrase:** a group of words containing a noun and other words that add information about it, for example: the tall boy with the dark hair

**vowel:** the letter a, e, i, o or u

consonant: any letter of the alphabet that is not a vowel


Circle all the incorrect articles in one colour. Then add the correct articles in a second colour
