Page 10

This question has been reworded as follows (changes from the Student Book in bold):

Explain one way in which medieval Jewish migration to England was different to 16th century Huguenot migration to England.

The advice in the Exam Tip is unchanged, except the reference to periods is altered to match those in the revised question. You may wish to set this question for students later in the course, after they have covered the Huguenots.

Page 21

This question has been reworded as follows (changes from the Student Book in bold):

Explain why many migrants to England from Europe continued to settle successfully during the 13th century.

You may use the following in your answer:

- Weavers from the Low Countries
- Bankers from Lombardy

You must use information of your own (12 marks)

Page 43

This question has been reworded as follows (changes from the Student Book in bold):

Explain why the experiences of European Protestant Migrants changed in England throughout the period 1550-1750.

You may use the following in your answer:

- Manufacturing skills
- The poor harvest of 1709

You must also use information of your own (12 marks)

Explain one way in which job opportunities for Jewish migrants in the 19th century were different from job opportunities for Indian migrants in the 17th century.

Page 82

This question has been reworded as follows (changes from the Student Book in bold):

Explain why prejudice against Jews in Britain increased from the 18th century to the 19th century.

You may use the following in your answer:

- language
- migration from Russia
